CHAIR'S REPORT



2023 has been a hugely successful year for Shaun Parker & Company, and after the past few years, feels like a return to focusing on solely what we love – performing, touring and creating. With many opportunities to showcase the creativity of Shaun Parker & Company, 2023 has been an exciting and rewarding year.

We kicked off with KING at the Seymour Centre as part of WorldPride. An exploration of group dynamics, sexuality and masculinity with the globally renowned Ivo Dimchev and ten of our gravity defying dancers. Rave reviews from all sides and standing ovations set the Company up for its' European tour across Germany, Italy, and Luxemburg. Touring presents the Company with many opportunities – a broader audience, arts institutions that are funded to financially support their performers and creatives, and, of course, the joy of performing in different locations.

Unbelievably, we also took *Trolleys* on tour – our outdoor work with heavy, metal shopping trolleys, which really needs to be seen to be believed – and astounded audiences sitting in piazzas and squares in cities across Germany and Italy.

We also toured extensively in Australia with *Found Objects*, delighting local community audiences around NSW, and in the Adelaide DreamBIG Festival.

A key aspect of Shaun Parker & Company is our continuing commitment to mentoring emerging queer artists and again we have seen alumni thrive. It is Shaun's dedication to mentoring which has assisted a number of artists launch in the harsh reality that is the arts sector. The new cultural policy, Creative Australia, announced this year, is a much-needed focus on the arts. However, if it is to revive the arts to being a central tenant of our society and ensure a growth in audiences and opportunities, appropriate funding needs to flow into the arts. Small to medium arts bodies, and dance in particular, need supporting if we are to have a vibrant and uplifting arts sector that enriches us all.

The 50th anniversary of the Sydney Opera House, that we were delighted to be part of, in the streaming of *AM I*, reflected the talent of the sector. To grow and thrive, the sector needs funding that appreciates the diversity of organisations and people within it, and recognises the work being produced across the sector.

We continue to take part in the Board Observership program supporting aspiring directors learn about the workings of a board. I am privileged to be able to showcase our board of highly engaged and hard working directors – who support me as Chair, and Shaun as Artistic Director so well

Shaun Parker & Company is fortunate to be supported financially by a number of sponsors and individuals who share our dreams and value our creative output. Our dancers and all the creatives which support the work, require their support and we thank them for it. ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Our dancers and I were thrilled to leap with reckless abandon into 2023!

The year began with an invitation by Sydney WorldPride to relaunch our major work KING, which featured the demonic Ivo Dimchev and ten of our outstanding dancers! KING was originally created in 2019, and following an initial international tour, was shut down by the pandemic for almost four years! Yet, KING was reborn, and soon after the Sydney season in February/March 2023, we set off for an extensive tour of Germany, Italy and Luxembourg! We opened the Bolzano Dance Festival in Italy which was an absolute honour!

Our family and community outdoor work *FOUND OBJECTS* also had a prolific year with touring throughout South West NSW, Adelaide's Dream BIG Children's Festival, and The New Annual Festival in Newcastle! We also performed *TROLLEYS* in Germany and Italy too, including a collaboration with a wonderful "sketch drawing" collective in Darmstadt, Germany, whose artists created a series of works of our dancers live-in-action. We have included several of our favourite sketches later in this report because we loved them so much!

The dancers and I also found time to work on our new show in development *BUBBLE*, and dramaturge and *QUEER BITES* alumni Felicity Nicol worked with me on writing the first draft of the script! We are so excited to develop this new work further with the dancers, *BUBBLE* artist, and videographers in 2024!

Our *QUEER BITES* mentorship went from strength to strength with two of our alumni embarking on new projects: the first being two new works by electro-pop dance artist Dyan Tai, and a reimaging of a cult work at Performance Space by veteran performance artist Barbarella Karpinski! I was so proud to see their work flourish, and to see them curate and direct a series a projects in their own right, alongside my mentorship! It was so very rewarding!

When I was approached by Parisian fashion house HERMÈS to create a new work, I was absolutely delighted! In particular because 29 years ago I danced in a fashion show for HERMÈS, choreographed by the legendary Meryl Tankard! It was a definitely a "full circle" moment! And even better, I was commissioned to work with 15 dancers! What a dream!

We also had a special invitation to be a part of the Sydney Opera House's 50th Anniversary celebrations! What an honour! They streamed our major work, *AM I*, to thousands of viewers across the globe as a part of these celebrations! The feedback was amazing, and to hear the original musical score by Nick Wales again was a real treat!

It was so lovely to see the feature film installation LUNACY, with direction by Daniel Askill, finally have its launch on Billong-olola Island (Shark Island) in Sydney Harbour. The film will be live-streamed on Apple TV+ and Google TV in April 2024! I learnt so much about choreographing for film, and I was lucky enough to utilise six incredible actors as my movement canvas!

I would like to thank Create NSW, who were our key funding partners for 2023, and Creative Australia, for their project investment! Also many thanks to the City of Sydney, South West Arts, City of Newcastle, Inner West Council, and 107 Projects too!

And from the bottom of my heart, I want to thank my dancers, my creative collaborators, my producing team, and our wonderful Board whose support and understanding is paramount, especially in a somewhat robust arts environment!

And a big shout out to our major donor Penny and (the late) Richard Hunstead, the Wales Family Foundation, and our global partners, the Denise & Michael Kellen Foundation, for their kind and generous support! I was lucky enough to visit Denise in New York in November, and the thrill of being in New York City again remains with me! We shall return!

May the dance be with you!

COMPANY PROFILE



Shaun Parker & Company is one of Australia's most wide-reaching dance companies. Amongst the cohort of Australian dance companies, it punches above its weight in terms of international touring and engagement with young people. Its' work takes place on the stages of major international festivals as a result of its artistic and dramaturgical rigour, but resonates just as strongly in public spaces, regional Australia, and among school students. The work is renowned for its ability to connect with audiences through its use of touching human vignettes and stunning musical scores.

Based in Sydney, the Company has garnered considerable international success having toured to 21 countries globally including Germany, Austria, France, Spain, Sweden, Luxembourg, Belgium, The Netherlands, Italy, Serbia, Lebanon, Jordan, Palestine, Egypt, Malaysia, Singapore, Taiwan, New Zealand, USA, and the UK, including a sold-out season at London's prestigious dance house Sadler's Wells. The Company has won two Australian Dance Awards, the Shirley McKechnie Award for Choreography, a Banksy Award (New Zealand), the Argus Angel Award (UK), the Bearer of Hope Award (Germany) and a Helpmann Award nomination for Best Presentation for Children. The Company won the NSW Premier's Creative Achievement Award, was nominated for the CHASS Prize for New Work, and was finalist in the NSW Premier's Export Award in the Creative Industries category. The Company won the NSW Premier's Resilience Award in the Creative Arts, for its strategic pivot and success throughout the pandemic and lockdown periods.

The Company has ongoing prestigious agency representation in Europe with Meinrad Huber at Ecotopia Productions who

promotes and facilitates European touring opportunities, presentations and co-commissions, linking the Company with key players internationally.

The Company also has a role in providing emerging dancers with opportunities to develop their skills and career trajectory including the ongoing mentorships of Joel Fenton as Project Coordinator and Queer Bites mentees Dyan Tai, Felicity Nicol, and Barbarella Karpinski on their various projects. The Company is constantly developing the skills of our core Sydney based dancers, and the Company also employs and develops the skills of many young producers, production staff and creative collaborators.

The Company continues to contribute to the professional development of its key ensemble of dancers to an international standard through their participation in numerous workshops, creative developments, performances and touring.

Shaun Parker & Company is currently supported by the New South Wales Government through Create NSW multiyear funding (2021-2025), project funding through Creative Australia and partnerships with City of Sydney, Inner West City Council and Creative Partnership's Plus1 program.

The Company also receives generous support from our Global Partner, the Denise & Michael Kellen Foundation and our Major Donors, Penny and (the late) Richard Hunstead and The Wales Family Foundation. Shaun Parker & Company continues their ongoing partnership with 107 Projects and City of Sydney through their residency at the Joynton Avenue Creative Centre in Zetland.



THE WORKS

KING SYDNEY WORLDPRIDE & EUROPEAN TOUR

SYNOPSIS

KING is a music-dance collaboration between award-winning Australian Director / Choreographer Shaun Parker, internationally renowned Bulgarian-born Vocalist Ivo Dimchey, and ten outstanding dancers.

Set in a fantastical realm that is part elite cocktail-bar, and part jungle, *KING* interrogates the power systems that oppress and hinder the natural development of male sexuality and identity in the form of a biting, yet humorous theatrical experience. Parker's highly physical and articulate choreographic world in *KING* intertwines with the scorching live sung narration of Dimchev's deconstructed operatic and cabaret-esque vocals. The key protagonist and archetype in *KING* is observed as a naked man, and we witness the male body as a commodity for anthropological observation. The juxtaposition of Dimchev's gloriously sung counter-tenor against the male dominated world created in *KING*, provides a compelling counterpoint to the notion of the power and brutality found within the context of historic masculinity and socio-sexual-political structures.

KING went into rehearsals in December 2022 to rework and remount the production in preparation for the major Sydney WorldPride Arts festival season in February–March 2023! Shaun Parker & Company continues its legacy in ensuring that dancers have ample time in rehearsals to build stamina and skills in preparation for the particular demands of each work, as well as providing much needed employment for our outstanding dancers.

Following our successful Sydney season, we jetted off to Europe for highly anticipated performances in Germany, Luxembourg and Italy.

FOUND OBJECTS AUSTRALIAN TOUR

SYNOPSIS

FOUND OBJECTS is an epic, outdoor, family, dance-theatre work utilising everyday objects and five exceptional dance and physical theatre artists. Choreographed by Shaun Parker and set to a stunning orchestral score by composer Nick Wales, the work creates a highly physical, extraordinary urban world incorporating high-octane contemporary dance, acrobatics, street dance, parkour and seemingly ordinary objects. FOUND OBJECTS consists of a quartet of works.

SPIN – four friends playing basketball discover new and exciting worlds in an adventure that sees one ordinary basketball become the centre of an imaginative and thrilling adventure.

AXLE – a duet between a parkour performer and a remote-control car featuring a stunning elecro-acoustic score by Nick Wales. A dancer is chased, berated and bullied by a seemingly out-of-control remote-control car. Soon, the dancer realises the remote-control car is actually looking for friendship, and a series of epic and acrobatic vignettes ensue.

HOVER – A 20-minute, outdoor work for five dancers on Hoverboards, choreographed by Shaun Parker. Using breakdance, tutting, popping and krumping, Shaun Parker integrates these highly popular dance forms with the humorous and visually compelling trajectories of the hoverboards in an homage to pop groups throughout the ages.

BUBBLE CREATIVE DEVELOPMENT

SYNOPSIS

BUBBLE is a dance and visual arts collaboration between Director / Choreographer Shaun Parker and bubble performance artist Chung Tai Su and tells a story of teenage girl's fight against global warming. Led by live Steadicam footage, our narrative follows the journey of a single bubble through to an epic climax in an exquisitely choreographed single-shot, alongside four dancers, transforming the stage into a spectacular live cinema. Part contemporary dance theatre, part visual arts, part narrated fairy tale, BUBBLE will feature a vast array of elemental devices including mist, laser, and smoke, signifying humanities complex relationships with technology and the environment.

In 2023, we further developed the choreographic and live video elements, and developed the first draft of the script. In 2024, we will embark on the next stages of the creative development.



QUEER BITES - HANTU MUSIC VIDEO

SYNOPSIS

In 2023, our *QUEER BITES* alumni Dyan Tai produced their new music video *HANTU*, mentored by our Artistic Director Shaun Parker, and featuring several of our *QUEER BITES* mentees and allies.

The video, for Tai's latest single *Hantu*, was filmed on location in one of Sydney's many hidden industrial warehouses and features Tai performing alongside five Sydney dancers, to Parker's choreography.

The pair's creative collaboration on *Hantu* builds on the success of Parker's multi-award-winning music video for Tai's single, *DO IT 4U*, in 2022, for which he also brought in local dancers to perform alongside the acclaimed performance and cabaret artist turned electronic musician.

Hantu, which means ghost, is an empowering and liberating electronic anthem exploring queer liberation and fusing elements of the artists' multicultural heritage and features Malaysian and Indonesian soundscapes layered with delicate Tuvan throat singing. Hantu inspired by Tai's upbringing in Malaysia and diasporic migration experience.



PERMAISURI QUEER BITES

SYNOPSIS

In November 2023, Shaun Parker continued his mentorship of Dyan Tai, supporting them on their first headlining show *PERMAISURI*, at the Red Rattler Theatre, in Marrickville, NSW.

PERMAISURI: The Gaysian Empress Rises was an interdisciplinary music and performance art project by electronic artist, singer, and DJ, Dyan Tai. Drawing on their background as a trilingual, Malaysian-born, Chinese-Australian artist, the show explored queer identity and the diasporic migrant experience in Australia.

Accompanied by immersive projection art by Juune Lee, *PERMAISURI* highlights Tai's signature use of Asiatic soundscapes and Chinese operatic drag; intersected with glitchy, hyper-pop and breakcore club samples as an ode to queer nightlife. Featuring original compositions from Tai, *PERMAISURI* is a joyous celebration of culture and community that marks the culmination of Tai's work as a trailblazer in Sydney's music, arts and cabaret scene.
